1. CEC Equality and Diversity framework

Try and get a good set of outcome themes with stuff that's relevant and makes sense. But also achievable

Broad set of themes- 5 different equality areas. Each area has a main goal. These will be reviewed every year.

Went out to ask people if those themes make sense and want to continue to work closely with communities and services.

1: Inclusive Communities Affected mostly women, disabled people and minorities About having safe working spaces Support mechanisms within local communities

2: Access to Services and Support- Infrastructure looking at community hubs, 20 min neighbourhoods etc,.

-Improved web services etc.

-Making buildings easier to use and accessible for everyone

3: Warm and Affordable Homes- Increase the number of homes, make heating affordable, Make it easier to apply for a home.

4: Health, Wellbeing and More Opportunities for Children and Young People-Education provision having a more inclusive curriculum. Tackling prejudice bullying etc. being able to record that behaviour so we can effectively tackle those issues. 5: Diverse and Inclusive Work-

Attitudes- staff networks, training, unconscious bias training, gender pay gap, improving the councils ability to serve its citizens.

Ask for forum members. Look through the framework and the work we have done, give us feedback. Let us know what we have done well, what you think might need adjustments and what might we have missed.
